## Searching on JACoW

All of the files published on JACoW contain hidden fields for the Authors names, the title and the keywords.

The Inktomi search engine builds an index based on these hidden fields as well as an index to the full text of all papers.

Boolean searches are possible, making it easy to find papers of particular interest, for example:

**Author:** +poole -"J. Poole"

would return all of the papers written by Poole apart from those written by J. Poole

Other examples:

**Keyword:** +H-minus -cyclotron -ion-source

**Text:** +"beam-beam interaction" +luminosity +proton

The latter will make a full text search for these criteria

## JACoW Activities

The JACoW team provides and maintains the website but it also produces templates for conference papers in Word (with versions for PC and MAC) and LaTeX.

In addition to the proceedings of each conference, meta data concerning citations are published for use in library catalogues.

The team meets at least once per year to review technical matters and the Steering Committee meets each year at PAC or EPAC.

In 2003 the JACoW Scientific Programme Management System (SPMS) was implemented. Built around a central repository of author and institute profiles it handles papers and abstracts through the whole process for proceedings production and publication.
