

Application and services (tools) are written in the same language (usually C++ or Java) and bound into a single executable.
Advantages - performance, troubleshooting


Application Built with Networked HTTP Services



- Client applications talk to services using HTTP and a RESTful interface.
- Services are tools written in any language and wrapped with an HTTP service shell.
- Advantages
 - supports a wide variety of clients
 can reuse toolkits as networked services
 easy to assign service responsibility

Multiple Applications Sharing HTTP Services

• A Reverse Proxy Server allows networked services to be shared by many applications.



- The server:
 - routes clients to the appropriate service
 permits remote and mobile clients
 provides load balancing where needed
 limits connections to prevent DOS attacks
 - provides added security, SSL termination
